

FROM THE OCHS ARCHIVES ...

A Fascinating Story

As with so many donations received by the Ozaukee Historical Society, there comes not only a valued document or artifact but also a fascinating story. Such is the case of a simple folding clothes hanger engraved with the family name of Lauterbach. Pictured here is Archive Volunteer, Laurie Bell who received this hanger from her neighbor Kathy Loppnow.

Justus Lauterbach immigrated from Germany in 1856. He was a professional tailor trained while still in Germany and performed his trade in Milwaukee. Facing limited opportunities for suitable employment and wages in Wisconsin he often traveled to Louisiana and Arkansas hoping to find a better a prospect for his skill as a tailor. During one of his stints in the South, Fort Sumter was bombarded and the Civil War broke out. During this period Lauterbach had established his own business in Napoleon Arkansas. He was hired by a local merchant who had a contract with the Confederacy to make uniforms. Shortly thereafter conscription was enacted forcing all male residents including Lauterbach to be assigned to the Confederate Army.

With loyalties to the North and his desire to return to his wife and family in Wisconsin, Lauterbach began his plan to escape conscription and secretly travel through the Confederacy without detection. Not having been paid by the merchant for over 100 uniforms, he appealed for the remuneration of his services to finance his trip home. Almost the entire payment was made in silver coins of quarter and half dollars. This required Lauterbach to fashion canvas belts to store and hide his coins during his travel to the North.

The night before he was to report to his assigned regiment, Lauterbach closed his store and hid under the building. The following night he was able to leave his concealment and use back streets and alleys to make his way to a steamer which passage had been secured earlier by a German friend. He was able to avoid detection and slip by guards to board the Hiawatha Steamer. Once on board, he found his state room and limited his exposure until arriving in St. Louis which had recently been secured by the Union forces. Eventually he made his way to Illinois and on to Milwaukee where he continued his career as a tailor.

Being influenced by President Lincoln's appeal for volunteers, Lauterbach enlisted and was assigned to Company C of the 24th Wisconsin. He attained the rank of sergeant and participated in the battles of Mission Ridge, the Knoxville and Atlanta campaigns. After a bout with typhoid, he once again joined the regiment in the Battle of Nashville serving as General Sheridan's personal tailor and was close to the General as his troops pursued General Lee.

Upon his release from duty, Lauterbach moved his family to Cedarburg and established a haberdashery and tailoring services in 1865. His family continued this business until 1984. The building at W62N553 Washington Avenue now houses Lillies, owned by Jim and Karen Lillie.


Featured Bluegrass Band... Henhouse Prowlers

BLUEGRASS AT THE VILLAGE-Ozaukee County Pioneer Village-Sun, August 14, 2022

The OCHS is excited to announce this year's bluegrass lineup including-Genesee Ridge, The Milbillies, Pickin' Up Speed, Chicken Wire Empire and the featured band, Henhouse Prowlers. The Henhouse Prowlers have traveled the world as the "Ambassadors of Bluegrass". They have a wonderful teaching outreach program where they share their music with many impoverished nations, most recently Uganda and Pakistan. The Henhouse Prowlers provide workshops, school programs and learn about ancient instruments from the places they visit. Playing bluegrass music for 17 years, they have released numerous CDs with their signature harmonies and classic tradition.

As usual, the event includes a wide variety of food, desserts and beverages including a beer and wine tent. A live auction will be held of items provided by local area businesses.


