Our Society Inherits A National Shrine

Looking at the picture of a handsome one room school building on the front page of the Pioneer Review, you would not believe that only thirty short years ago it stood in ruins, dilapidated, with part of the front wall down.

The description of the ruins is contained in a news story of the first official dedication held on June 14, 1947, as the site of the first Flag Day observance.

The building only a short time prior to the dedication had been deeded by the Town of Fredonia at the annual township meeting to the Wisconsin Fraternal Congress.

It had been closed for twenty years and then converted into a garage for the town truck and later left abandoned.

But it rose from adversity and ruin to become a national shrine because of a young school teacher, a president of the United States and a fraternal organization.

On June 14, 1885, Bernard J. Cigrand, 19, and the teacher of the school, stirred by a deep sense of patriotism and love for the American Flag, held the first Flag Day exercises in the little country schoolhouse on top of Schumacher Hill in the Town of Fredonia. Later he was to become professor of Dentistry at Northwestern University, and he was one of many influential people who prevailed upon President Woodrow Wilson to declare June 14 National Day.

The Wisconsin Fraternal Congress arranged the first dedication program in 1947, and raised a flag that had flown over the nation's capitol. The chairman was Leroy Stohlman, supreme treasurer of the Aid Association for Lutherans, and president of the Wisconsin Fraternal Congress; Toastmaster was John F. Walsh, president of the Catholic Knights of Wisconsin, and secretary - treasurer of the Wisconsin Congress, and the speaker was Rev. William Danian, arch deacon of the Episcopal Diocese of Milwaukee.

The speakers said they expect the National Fraternal Congress to restore the school house to its original appearance and condition so that the birthplace of Flag Day can be fittingly honored each year.

Last June, after the Flag Day celebration, the National Fraternal Congress announced that they would deed the school house over to the Ozaukee County Historical Society with the provision that the Congress can use it one day a year on June 14th for Flag Day observance.

The National Congress have restored and kept the building in beautiful shape. They have improved the grounds, provided a small grand-stand for the audiences, and a few years ago, added additional acreage, and have built an interesting garden plot with plants and bushes, and a winding path with sunken holes, in which (Continued on page 4)

Stepping back in time to the OCHS September 1977 Quarterly Newsletter... This issue of the Pioneer Village Review shares the story of how the Ozaukee County Historical Society came to own Stony Hill School. The school located in the Town of Fredonia is listed on the National Register of Historic Places which is the official list of the Nation's historic place worthy of preservation. Thousands of schoolchildren have spent time at Stony Hill School since it was acquired by the OCHS experiencing life in a one room schoolhouse by participating in the OCHS school tour program.





1 tsp. Vanilla

2 cups Flour

1 tsp. Baking Soda

2 cups Rhubarb—cut up

Mix all ingredients and pour into a greased and floured 9 X 13 cake pan.

TOPPING

1/4 C. White Sugar

1/4 C. Brown Sugar

1 tsp. Cinnamon

Sprinkle topping over and bake at 350 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes.

The Stony Hill School Program

The Stony Hill School program is a historical two-hour program with a simulated experience in a one-room school. The school teacher, dressed in authentic 1880 period costume, and using books and materials of that day, teaches the children what it was like to attend school in Ozaukee County 100 years ago, and encourages an appreciation for the education system of today.

Our goal is to give 4th grade students an opportunity to understand and appreciate "old-fashioned" values, the educational system of the past, and the work ethic. Children will learn to recognize the differences and similarities in procedure between the school of the 1880's and that of today. We hope to instill in the children a sense of patriotism and pride for the U.S. flag, and for the educational system our ancestors developed 100 years ago. While the programming is geared toward 4th grade, we are able to accommodate most age groups and tailor the program to your grade level and curriculum needs. Please call for more information.

A. Spend from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at Stony Hill School. Curriculum includes: raising the flag, reading from 1880 readers, writing using quill pens, arithmetic, using a slate, ringing the school bell, and sitting in desks connected to each other.

- B. Spend from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at Stony Hill School. Lunch and free time from 11:30 to 12:00 noon.
 - 1. 12:00 noon—Go to Pioneer Village*
 - 2. 12:15-2:15 p.m.—Tour Pioneer Village, an 1840-1900's Living Museum...Twenty furnished buildings present life as it was 100-150 years ago in this county. Visit the Indian Trading Post, the German designed homes, the Blacksmith Shop and the Railroad Depot to name just a few. All experiences are intended to demonstrate life in rural communities of long ago.

Times are suggested and may be adjusted to meet your specific needs.

To accommodate two classes at one time; one class may tour Pioneer Village in the morning and attend Stony Hill School in the afternoon. This allows for a more unique and meaningful tour for the students.

Dates are available from May until Mid-June, and from Labor Day to Mid-October.

This is a rare opportunity for your students to experience a typical classroom situation as it pertains to the 1880's, as well as to see and experience the settings where people of that time lived and worked.
